

Construction Crew Leader Volunteer

Leadership of volunteers on the construction site is critical to completing our new homes and home repair projects on time and on budget. Crew Leader Volunteers are trained to assist Habitat for Humanity of Greater Chattanooga by leading and training construction volunteers, as well as learning and passing on the mission of Habitat. In addition, they provide direct supervision of projects and ensure that goals established by the Habitat Chattanooga Construction Staff are achieved.

Reports To:

• Director of Construction and Project Managers

Responsibilities:

- Maintain site safety through modeling of safety practices and guidelines as dictated by OSHA and the Habitat Construction Staff
- Take Habitat International's "Competent Person" training and provide completed certificate to Volunteer Manager
- Teach and lead a crew of 2-10 volunteers of varying experience levels on any given component of the building process
- Assist with all aspects of the home building and home repair process
- Assist in loading and unloading of building materials and tools on site as needed
- Lead clean-up on assigned task, assist with leading clean-up on entire site at end of day
- Provide positive communication and support to volunteers

Time Commitment:

- Commit to leading volunteer crews and/or assisting Habitat Construction Site during the week at least four times a month to be considered active
- Arrive early to the build site to prepare for volunteers

Preferred Qualifications:

- Positive team player with ability to motivate and lead
- Ability to be on one's feet for extended periods of time
- Ability to bend, squat, lift and make repetitive motions
- Ability to work in varying weather conditions (i.e. heat, cold, wind)
